- Work as part of an inter-professional health care team in one of the Forensic Regional Clinics in either Kelowna, Prince George, Surrey, Vancouver or Victoria; providing counselling services to clients with co-occurring substance use and mental health disorders.
- Perform individual psychosocial assessments.
- Provide individual substance use and mental health counselling.
- Conduct group counselling sessions.
- Deliver psycho-educational group sessions.
- Plan, implement and assess individualized client treatment programs using a trauma-informed framework and culturally safe methods.

As the successful candidate, you will:

- Facilitate psycho-education and manualized substance use and mental health group treatment.
- Provide evidence-based, trauma-informed individualized substance use and mental health
- Participate in individualized treatment plans development and implementation.
- Enroll patients in support programs.
- Monitor systems to ensure client, staff, family and general public safety and take action as
- Develop and present seminars about substance use, concurrent disorder, mental illness, trauma and other related issues to clients in consultation with the inter-professional team and professional practice leaders. Participate in the orientation and continuing education of counselling and health care professions and students. Contribute information in rounds, committees and staff meetings.

Qualifications

You have a:

- Master's Degree in an allied health discipline (counselling and/or social work) from an approved and accredited post-secondary institution.
- Three (3) years' of recent related clinical experience, including at least one (1) years' experience in a concurrent disorder program providing therapeutic individual and group counselling.
- Registered with a recognized professional body.

You also have:

- Comprehensive knowledge of substance dependence and concurrent disorders.
- Broad knowledge of psychopharmacology (indications and side-effects), trauma-informed practice, and chronic diseases such as HIV and Hepatitis C.
- Demonstrated skill in and experience with motivational interviewing/therapy and cognitive behavioral therapy.
- Broad knowledge of adult education principles, methods, and tools.
- Comprehensive knowledge of and experience in group dynamics, individual counselling, and family therapy.

You have a demonstrated ability to:

- Communicate effectively orally, in writing and interpersonally and for public relations.
- Establish rapport with multi-barrier clients and a positive attitude toward clients with substance dependence and concurrent disorder.
- Collaborate on program evaluation.
- Work well as a member of an inter-professional team or independently.
- Adjust to new or unexpected events, problem solve, establish priorities, and deal effectively with
