As a Family Therapist, Child and Youth Mental Health, you demonstrate specialized knowledge and training in working with complex family systems in order to collaborate and consult with other CYMH Clinicians to deliver family therapy to families who have a child or youth impacted by mental illness; and in working with colleagues to develop awareness of systemic perspectives on mental illness.
